COURTENAY MCKEON is an Assistant Federal Public Defender with the Office of the Federal Public Defender in Syracuse, New York. She received her B.A. in history from the University of Rochester in 1996 and her JD from the University of California, Davis School of Law in 1999. She spent the early part of her career litigating civil rights issues in the state and federal courts of California. From 2001 to 2007, she was a staff attorney in the California state court system. She moved to Syracuse in 2007, where she clerked for United States Magistrate Judge George H. Lowe until his retirement in 2012 and for United States Magistrate Judge Therese Wiley Dandels from 2012-2015. She has served as an adjunct professor at both the UC Davis School of Law and the Syracuse University College of Law.

LISA PEEBLES is the Federal Public Defender for the Northern District of New York. Lisa has been with the office of the Federal Public Defender since its creation in 1999. Prior to being the Federal Public Defender, Lisa was the 1st Assistant Defender, managing the Syracuse office.

JUAN JOSE RODRIGUEZ joined the Federal Public Defender Office in Syracuse, NY in 2012, working primarily on e-Discovery coordination and immigration. Before joining the Federal Defender office, he worked with the Division of Immigrant Policies and Affairs at the NYS Department of Labor, where he specialized in employment-based immigration. He received his JD from Villanova University School of Law, where he served as an editor of the *Villanova Environmental Law Journal*, and a BS/BA from Boston University School of Management. He is a member of the New York and New Jersey state bars.

KIM ZIMMER received a B.A. in Economics from the College of the Holy Cross in 1985, and a JD from Cornell University Law School in 1988. Ms. Zimmer entered the Department of Justice's Honors Program. As a Trial Attorney in the Northern Criminal Enforcement Section, Ms. Zimmer was responsible for federal criminal prosecutions involving federal tax violations. During her tenure at the Tax Division, Ms. Zimmer received a Special Achievement Award for the prosecution and trial of *United States v. Galy Terminal's Corp. et al.* Ms. Zimmer was an Assistant United States Attorney (1991-1998) for the Northern District of New York in Albany, New York. As an Assistant United States Attorney, Ms. Zimmer was responsible for all stages of federal criminal prosecutions. Ms. Zimmer opened her own practice in 1998, and works in both state and federal courts. Ms. Zimmer is the current Criminal Justice Act representative for the NIDNY.

HON. BRENDA SANNES, U.S. District Judge—Brenda K. Sannes is a United States District Judge for the Northern District of New York. At the time of her appointment in 2014 she was the Appellate Chief in the United States Attorney's Office in that district. Judge Sannes earned her B.A. degree magna cum laude, with distinction in the English Department from Carleton College in 1980. She earned her JD degree magna cum laude from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 1983 where she was an articles editor for the law review and was elected to the Order of the Coif. She moved to Central New York in 1994 and was an Assistant United States Attorney in the Northern District of New York from 1995 until her judicial appointment in 2014. She served as the Appellate Chief from 2005 until her appointment to the bench.

GEOFF CHESHIRE is a Legal and Policy Attorney Advisor at the Defender Services Office (DSO) of the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts. Before joining DSO, Geoff was an Assistant Federal Public Defender for the District of Arizona for almost thirteen years. He has been a visiting attorney to DSO's Legal and Training Divisions as well as visiting defender with the U.S. Sentencing Commission's Office of General Counsel where he worked on the "Drugs -2" Guideline amendment. Geoff is also active in the Federal Bar Association, where he has served as president of the Tucson and Capitol Hill FBA Chapters as well as national chair of the Criminal Law Section.

JAMES EGAN is an Assistant Federal Public Defender, and head of the Appellate division for the Office of the Federal Public Defender for the Northern District of New York, where he has worked since graduating from Syracuse University College of Law in 2007.
